I have been following the recommendations to the DOI for proposed insurance coverage plans to

be adopted by the Silver State Health Insurance Exchange. As a Speech-Language Pathologist,

it is of great concern to me that two of the three proposed plans do not cover speech therapy

services. As a practitioner working with infants and toddlers birth to age three, I see first hand

and in the families' homes how communication and feeding therapy services can dramatically

impact a child's health and development. If these services are not provided (which will be very

likely to occur if insurance does not cover the therapy), these children are at a much higher risk of $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) +\left(1$

long-term learning disabilities that would require special education services when they enter the

school system. Research has shown again and again that early intervention saves money in the

long run. I urge you to look at the long-term picture and vote for the most fiscally responsible

package, Plan D. Paying for communication services in the critical early years of development

will save money in the end.
